A rare Worcester sauceboat

A rare Worcester pedestal sauceboat, the loop handle with scroll thumbpiece, printed in 'smoky primitive' style to the interior, probably by Robert Hancock, with lovers amongst ruins, the rim painted in coloured enamels with flowers, the exterior printed with a church and a watermill, within scroll moulded cartouches picked out in puce, 7 1/2" long, circa 1754-55, no mark
