A rare pair of Derby figures of a shepherd and shepherdess in Scottish dress, each standing, he wearing a tartan jacket, 'tam o' shanter' and playing bagpipes, and she wearing a matching tartan bodice, and flower painted skirt, each mould base applied with coloured flowers and leaves, 6 1/4" high, circa 1758, no marks
